

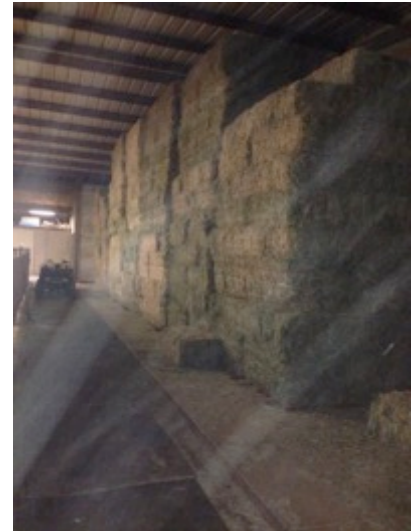


Horses' Honor--December 2014

OUR CDS CONNECTION

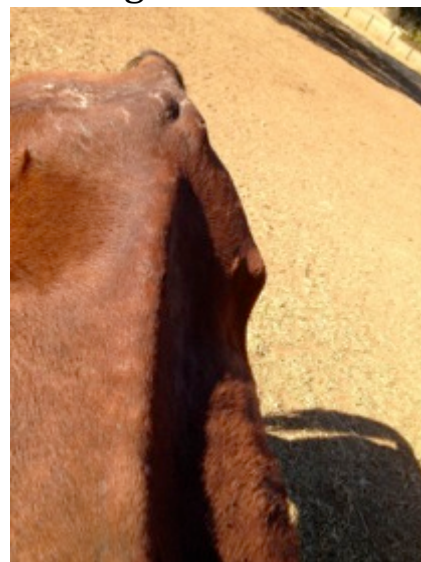
